Keith Johnson is a blues guitarist, harmonica player, and songwriter carrying forward a powerful family legacy. A great-nephew of Muddy Waters and grandson of gospel singer and radio host Texcellar Fields, Keith was born in Glen Allen, Mississippi. He holds a B.S. in Audio Engineering and an MBA in Human Resource Management from Delta State University.

Keith's debut album *Come to Mississippi* and his books *Freeman: Opening the Case* and *Come to Mississippi: The Birthplace of the Blues* reflect his deep roots and storytelling spirit. He's performed across the U.S., Europe, and Brazil with the Big Muddy Band, sharing stages with legends and appearing on Hulu's *Searching for Soul Food* and *Huckberry's Ramble On*. In 2020, blues icon Bobby Rush passed him the "Blues Torch" at the Delta Blues & Heritage Festival.

Keith continues to honor his heritage through music, writing, and global performances.
